

The following is a summary of the main points discussed at the Parish Council Meeting on 8th August 2017

To Goldshaw Booth Parish Residents

Matters Arising From Previous Meeting

Bob Donovan reported that the Legionella Risk Assessment in respect of the toilets has been issued.

The lengthsman has been asked to undertake clearance works on the public footpath adjacent to the mill site.

The trees have been cut back by residents at the eastern end of Osborne Terrace as requested.

Reports from Councillors

Kathleen Wilkinson reported that residents have enquired about whether a bonfire night will be held this year. No decision has been taken.

Bob Donovan reported that the notice board has been installed by himself and Carl Ryder at Sabden Fold.

Chris Burt reported that he has cut the undergrowth around the small gate onto top playing field and pruned the wild rose by the toilets in Newchurch. He has spent most of the month clearing vegetation on the wall between Spenbrook and Newchurch with help from Alan Taylor. He asked for the wall to be repaired in Sparable Lane which has now been completed.

Chris Stuttard reported that the request to LCC to remove the redundant bus stop signs is on-going.

Carl Ryder reported that he has undertaken weed killing work on the lane to the south of Spen Brook Mill and that the hedge on Jinny Lane has been cut back.

Andrew Cowell reported that he would like the bus stop signs to be replaced by heritage type signs, if the signs are to remain. However, further investigations since the meeting have found that authorisation for this is unlikely unless the signs were mounted off the public highway.

Agenda Items

The environmental officer has inspected the pond and a programme of work has been agreed to start from October.

As part of the inspection programme for the play area, Bob Donovan will start work with the appointed volunteer shortly.
